

DEATH END NOBLE LIFE

Mrs. Frank Garry, Cedar Lake pioneer, died at St. Paul, October 14, after long illness. Mrs. Frank Garry passed away at her home, 414 Ashland Avenue, St. Paul at 6:00 pm on Monday, October 14.

Mrs. Garry had been in poor health for about two months and on July 2nd submitted to an operation which disclosed complications of a very serious nature. The last week of her illness was one of intense pain and her entire family were at her bedside during this time. She often requested those around her to pray that she may be able to endure the suffering, and Masses and prayers were continually offered. She had a beautiful death, the first time in Garry family, which will impress the memory of a loving husband, six daughters and four sons. Margaret O'Flynn, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. P. O'Flynn, was born on September 10, 1863 at Toronto, Canada living there until she was seven years old when the family came to Minnesota and located at Cedar Lake. On June 27, 1883, she was united in marriage to Frank J. Garry. They moved to St. Paul, on March 18, 1911, where she resided practically ever since with the exception of a few years spent on their farm in Euclid. Besides her sorrowing husband she is survived by six daughters, Misses Mayme, Sabina, Margaret and Florence Garry, Mrs. R.F. Connor of St. Paul, and Mrs. Emmett J. Fitzsimmons of Euclid, four sons, John, Joseph and Frank of Euclid and Jefferson of St. Paul, two sisters, Mrs. James Timmons of St. Paul, and Mrs. P.W. Murphy of Wallace, Idaho. Mrs. Murphy was unable to attend the funeral owing to the death of her husband at the same time.

Mrs. Garry was a noble, Christian women, tolerant of the shortcomings of others and practiced true Christian charity in its broadest sense. Her home life was very beautiful, devoting herself unselfishly to her husband and children and among them her memory will be most tenderly cherished. The home was thronged with sympathetic relatives and friends. The floral offerings were elegant and many were the kind remembrances in the way of Masses for the repose of her soul. The funeral was held from the Cathedral at 9:00 am on Thursday. Solemn Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Father Morgan, assisted by Reverend Fathers Keane and Gainney. Father Morgan delivered an eloquent and touching sermon on her most exemplary life. Mrs. Jane Holland sang a solo, "Jesus Be Her Eternal Rest." The pallbearers were: Thomas Hyland, Francis Webb, Thomas and Michael Hart, P.J. Sullivan and Michael Nash. Interment was in Calvary Cemetery.
